we lay our love before him, to cushion his walk.


Presider Setting aside all power, glory, and might, he comes:

The Palm Gospel: Mark 11:1-11

Reader The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

Reader The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

according to Mark.

All Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

When the disciples were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

into the redemption of your reconciling love.

On the night he was betrayed,

Jesus, at supper with his friends,

took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread,

gave it to them, and said, "Take and eat:

this is my body which is given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine,

and when he had given thanks,

he gave it to them,

and said, "Drink this, all of you:

this is my blood of the new covenant

which is shed for you and for many

for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Loving and Holy One,

recalling Christ's death and resurrection,

we offer you these gifts,

longing for the bread of tomorrow

and the wine of the age to come.

Therefore we proclaim our hope.

All Dying you destroyed our death,

rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Presider Pour out your Spirit on these gifts

that through them you may sustain us

in our hunger for your peace.

We hold before you

all whose lives are marked by suffering,

our sisters and brothers.

When we are broken and cast aside,

embrace us in your love.

All Restore us, O God, let your face shine!

Presider Through Christ, with Christ,

and in Christ in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

all honour and glory are yours,

O Source of all life, now and for ever.

All Amen.
